SOCIAL MEDIA

As our tamariki use more digital technology such as apps on phones it is important that we teach them about online safety.

As a parent it is important that you know what your child/children are doing online.

Here a four steps that can help you:

1<u>Understand</u> - Take time to read about possible online risks, challenges and sometimes illegal behaviour tamariki face

- 1. online bullying
- 2. unwanted contact
- 3. social media
- 4. sexting
- 5. inappropriate content

2. Learn about your child's online activities

It is important you understand more about the online activities and experiences your child has or wants to explore. Possible questions you may want to ask:

- why they like certain apps or sites?
- who is in their network?
- what information do they share?
- what they are enjoying?
- are they making music or videos?
- what are they playing?

3. Explore Take the time yourself to explore the sites, apps and technologies your child uses.

4. <u>Agree</u> - set an agreement with your tamariki about what they can do online including what apps they have on their phone.

It is important that we all know what our tamariki are doing online, including social media. Our tamariki need to be safe and we all need to take responsibility for this.
